Superintendent Elsay presented Board members with the results of a survey sedected by the West Bend, Wisconsin school district as to the desirable envilonment in a senior high school. There were 1239 principals from six surrounding states the replied to the questionnaire without any reasons being asked for or twen. In general administrators of schools of less than 1,000 enrollment remarked larger enrollment while administrators of schools of more than 1,500 members and schools of more than 1,500 members.

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The Superintendent also distributed copies of a resolution adopted by the mentive Board of the Ann Ar bor Teachers association requesting reconsideration of the adopted starting date of the 1964-65 school year. Board members referred the Administration.

QUESTIONS, COMMENTS, AND PETITIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

Lawrence Jones, President of the Northside P. T. O. asked the Board about its plans for opening Thurston School next year. He expressed concern about the crowded smillion at Northside should this not take place. Mr. Jones was informed that it is the present intent of the Board to open both Thurston and Lawton for 1964-65.

Charence H. Falstad, Jr. read a letter stating that the Board was "fostering and encouraging segregation" by building a seven room school on the Overridge site all white children from wealthy families while expressing a concern about appearion at the Jones School. Mr. Falstad contended that the Jones School smilter on which there was Board representation which had been set up to arrive a recommendations as to how the school might be desegregated would recommend the school to give the Board and Administration an "excuse" to move the school to give to Jones.

In reply President Coudron stated that there was no Board representation on Committee. Such Board members as attend are present in the capacity of resource when the stated that Falstad was determining what the Committees recommendation and doesn't use "excuses" for its actions but makes decisions on the basis of the sperintendent Elzsy stated that as long as two years ago the Administration already found it necessary to move some of its personnel to Jones School.

The Williams stated that the Jones School Committee was concerned with the school.

BOOK REPORT - THE NON - GRADED HIGH SCHOOL

Righ School, Melbourne, Florida, was presented by Scott Westerman, Assistant intendent for Instruction. A nongraded school is defined in the book as "a intendent for the individual student to pursue a course in which interested, and has the ability to achieve, without regard either to grade worthwhile is a program of independent study open to students of ability.
