Report on papyri, etc., of 1925 consignment.

The Nahman collection has already been reported on generally. Below follow the more detailed descriptions of the better preserved papyri selected for separate notice. These are followed by reports on the papyri acquired by Dr. Askren and Prof. Boak. There is a great mass of material, and the examination of the papyri was even more summary than usual. In the descriptions Roman numerals denote centuries (A.D. except where otherwise stated). L. = left, R. = right. Extreme dimensions are given.

These also are on the whole disappointing. There are some quite good and one or two fine pieces, and a fair number of the less prepossessing proved on examination to have features of interest; but there is a great mass of inferior fragments and mere rubbish. I selected for separate examination only the more promising fragments. Those left undescribed may very likely include some which are of value, but the majority are not promising. These papyri are all described in the inventory as "Ask. 1925".
